## A Word that Nourishes and Warms

On Sunday evening, at the end of the Mass, Pope Francis will give copies of the Gospel of Luke to five families from five of the world's major cities: Hanoi (Asia), Havana (America), Marseille (Europe), Sydney (Australia) and Kinshasa (Africa). In the coming days, 750,000 copies of the Gospel will arrive in these cities for distribution to local families, especially to those living on their outskirts.

The Gospel of Luke is the Good News of God's mercy for the human family.

These will be accompanied by a family that has come directly from Damascus, Syria, where the population is suffering from one of the greatest humanitarian tragedies of our time. Such a significant presence could not be lacking; it intends to remind everyone, in these days of celebration, of the situation of families affected by war and destruction.

In accord with the Apostolic Nunciature in Syria and thanks to the collaboration of CNEWA, we are beginning a fundraising campaign to support 6,000 families, who do not know how to keep warm during the coming winter, which is particularly harsh in that region. Approximately 350 US dollars per family are needed, for a total of about \$ 2 million.
